# Help Build Beaver Dam Analogs

In 2020 club members assisted with the first phase of the Potato Creek Beaver Dam Analogue (BDA) Project. We got dirty, pruned up a lot of brush, dragged it to spots on the very dry creek bottom, wove the brush into the pre-pounded log columns and created a large basket like structure that would eventually help the fishery by increasing surface and riparian area moisture levels. The following year we were treated to photographs of the area we worked in. Photos of cougar, bear and other forest critters made us realize that our efforts the previous fall had extreme benefits. This was in addition to seeing our dry creek bottom covered with over a foot of water and after a dry winter. The BDA system works in assisting waterways regain their original water moving and storing capabilities, all to the betterment of the local fishery. This fact was proven by another great picture taken by their game camera. A mature Steelhead heading upstream in what was the year before, an almost dry creek bed. Insert smiling emoji here...

#### May 4th Board Meeting Minutes- No Quorum present

### **President's Report:**

• Notice of sale of our AA Storage; currently pay \$47/month

- The club has until July 31<sup>st</sup> to vacate the unit.
- Steve Aguilu found that most storage units have a waitlist and the cheapest was around \$60.
- Another 5x10 unit will work but it might be a good idea to sell some of the stuff to make room.
- Steve Aguilu said that we should try to get on a couple of waitlists for a 5x10 unit and take the first one that becomes available.
- John Richmond very generously offered to store some stuff if we can't get into a unit in time before vacating the current unit.
- Report of Laptop status and reimbursement request (\$259.79)
  - Steve suggested that the club reimburses Dan Hammond and then Steve Aguilu will reimburse the club.
  - There was discussion concerning whether Steve should be solely financially responsible for the costs or should the club cover the costs for repair.
