




### TEMPERATURE DATA LOGGER DATA


















#### December 7, 2023 Virtual Board Meeting Minutes

#### **Program Chair Report:**

- December Presentation-
  - Gary Anderson said he has never had an organized agenda before and he has just let people do what they want.
- December Meal-
  - Same meal from last year: Prime Rib, potatoes, and salad
  - Steve Aguilu said he estimates 25-30 plates and that The Eagles would like to stay within 8 plates so they don't take a loss.
  - Steve Aguilu said we should send out a poll again to get a possible number of attendees.

#### **Old Business:**

- Banquet
  - a. Credit card reader: Bank does take a percentage and there might be some contractual obligations to look out for.

- Derek Corder said that since the announcement already went out concerning all tickets must be made in advance there wouldn't be a need to pursue a card reader at this time.
- b. Dan Hammond said that Gordy Northup offered to be an auctioneer if needed.
- c. Fundraising has technically stopped, but Dan Hammond said we can start again.
- d. Gary Anderson said that some people said the auction was too long last year, Steve Aguilu said he liked the idea of focusing more on fellowship at the banquet and just doing a raffle and do an online auction in the spring.
- e. Gary Anderson said that the silent auction is still important because members are going to be making things that go beyond raffle level.
- f. Dan Hammond said we could have a small live auction of a few high dollar items. Steve Aguilu added that things like fishing gear and outings would be good for the live auction and to keep the handmade crafts in the silent auction.

#### • Website:

- Bob Bartlett has worked with Patrick to set up a purchase page so members can buy their tickets, membership, and name tags.
- Page counters have been set up.
- Registration page project goals still haven't been met and it might be time to look for additional help.

#### **New Business:**

- Renewal of FFI membership
  - FFI may want a list of membership emails and Bruce Merighi said we should not provide them. There was agreement amongst the Board.
- Microsoft 365 membership renewal
  - There is no cost for renewal as Steve Aguilu originally set it up as a charitable organization.
- Scotty and Gordy have a fly rod that they were hoping to have as a door prize at the banquet.
  - There was a consensus amongst the board to have one door prize ticket per banquet ticket to make it easier to identify the winner.
